the patient communities they serve. The survey
was sent to targeted patient communities for
whom x4 Pharmaceuticals is actively developing
treatments. In particular, x4 Pharmaceuticals
wanted to identify patient concerns and areas to
improve clinical trials during the global pandemic.






RESULTS

Considering the COVID-19 pandemic, if your doctor said it was safe, would you be willing to go to a hospital or clinical trial site to take part in a clinical trial?





If all clinical trial-related appointments could be done at doctor offices near you instead of at a hospital or clinical trial site, would you be willing to take part in a clinical trial right now?



The survey responses revealed the following results:

- Patients skewed to US, Canada & Australia given this was an English-language survey
- Patients expect trial accommodations and tailoring for their needs
- Highly educated & sophisticated patient population may not find doctors assurances sufficient

WHAT PATIENTS SAID



"I rarely leave house. I have groceries delivered and my children sanitize before putting away. My children rarely leave the house and wear masks if they do then immediately wash hands when home. We do only virtual doctor appointments."

"We were already being cautious in our family. We take shoes off at the door, we wipe handles and Clorox a LOT. We limit exposure in large crowds."

"I don't go to stores. Order most items to be delivered. My husband goes to grocery store. We wear masks and gloves. If packages are delivered my husband takes them to the garage and wipes them down before coming into the house..."



KEY TAKEAWAYS

Survey results across different patient communities revealed:

- The majority of patients will participate in a clinical trial at a hospital or trial site if their doctor says it is safe
- The majority of patients will travel if their doctor says it is safe
- The majority of patients will participate in a trial at local doctor's offices
